## - SAN LUIS POTOSÍ

The city was founded in 1592 and declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 2010. *San Luis* comes from the King of France Louis IX; *Potosí* refers to the mines of Potosí in Bolivia.

In the 17th century San Luis was the most important city in northern Mexico, due to the deposits of gold and silver found in nearby Cerro de San Pedro. If you have some time, it is definitely worth giving this old mining town and its beautiful desertic surroundings a visit.

San Luis will amaze you with its rich history, stunning architecture and abundance of culture. If you have the chance, stay a couple of days to discover all that this city has to offer.

Visit one of the many museums, admire the beautiful churches, walk around the historical town or take a stroll in Tangamanga: the second largest urban park in Mexico. Too hot to walk? Hop on the city tour bus that departs from Plaza de Armas. Or simply sit down at one of the squares, enjoy the peacefulness of the city, and watch its inhabitants pass by.



# ONE DAY IN SAN LUIS

- Start your day with some gorditas for breakfast in the Morales district.
- Go around downtown in the city bus - departing from Plaza de Armas.
- Walk down Calzada de Guadalupe and visit the Leonora Carrington Museum.
- Take a little lunch break at the terrace of La Oruga y La Cebada.
- Got some room left for dessert? Try the delicious Chocolates Costanzo. There are multiple stores in town.
- Visit Museo de la Máscara, dedicated to Mexico´s masked dance and ritual heritage.
- Drink a mezcal at La Piquería or a craft beer at Callejón 7B.
- Enjoy enchiladas potosinas and tacos rojos in Antojitos El Pozole.
- Stroll around Plaza de Armas and Plaza del Carmen at night.

## GOT SOME EXTRA TIME?

- Discover the Tangamanga Park.
- Take a hike at Presa San José.
- Go on a little trip to Cerro de San Pedro
   21km from the city and approx. half an hour by car.



## — MUSEUMS

If you love arts and culture, San Luis is the place to be! The city is home to various museums and annual festivities. From contemporary art to surrealism, music and Mexican history: there is something for everyone. Cultural events are often poorly promoted, but luckily the tourism office of San Luis gives out a monthly cultural agenda in which upcoming events and concerts are listed. In August, Feria Nacional Potosina takes place. In April, the Holy Week is celebrated with concerts, exhibitions and other activities.

### Centro de las Artes y Museo Leonora Carrington

The complex that now houses the San Luis Arts Centre was originally built in the 19th century to serve as a state prison. The CEART is an institute dedicated to education, production and dissemination of art. Amongst others it houses a museum that features the work of surrealist sculptress Leonora Carrington and presents other temporary exhibits. Part of Carrington's work can also be found in a museum in her honor in Xilitla. Open 10-18 Tue - Sun. 50 MXN. Free on Wed.

#### Museo Nacional de la Máscara

Housed in a beautiful historic monument, the museum is dedicated to traditions and symbolism of masks in Mexican culture. With 1,300 pieces, it hosts Mexico's largest mask collection. The masks come from various ethnic traditions and mostly represent animals, devils, demons, saints, conquistadores, angels, and fantastic creatures.

Open 10-18 Tue-Fri,10-15 Sun-Mon,10-17 Sat. 20 MXN (+ camera fee). Free on Tue.



Based in an old passenger train station, this museum shows exhibitions about - want to take a guess? - trains and their impact on Mexican history. The old Monastery station was a central point in perhaps the most important train route in the country, which connected the country's capital to the United States.

Open 9-17 Tue-Fri, 11-17 Sat & Sun. 15 MXN.

Museo del Ferrocarril



Located in the Aranzazú square, the museum displays an important collection of pre-Hispanic artifacts from the Tamtoc Archaeological site, Mesoamerican cultures and customs of the first settlers of the area. Open 9-18 Tue-Sun. 55 MXN. Free on Sun.

Museo Regional Potosino

#### Museo del Virreinato

Next to the gorgeous Templo del Carmen, the museum displays a permanent collection consisting of colonial art, religious themes, antiquities, sacred art, and portraits. The various exhibitions take you on a historical journey from the fall of Tenochtitlán to the Mexican Independence. Open 10-19 Tue-Sat, 10-17 Sun. 15 MXN.

The Contemporary Art Museum annually presents four to five temporary exhibitions. For every new exhibition, the art space consisting of 5 rooms transforms completely. The focus lies on current artistic manifestations like video art, photography, and sound art. Open 10-18 Tue-Sat, 10-14 Sun. 20 MXN. Free on Sun.

Museo de Arte Contemp oráneo

Museo Interactivo Laberinto de Ias Ciencias y las Artes

Located in the Tangamanga Park, this interactive museum invites its visitors to explore its labyrinths and, in a playful way, learn more about science, art, and technology.

Open 11-16 Mon-Fri. 11-18 Sat & Sun. 50 MXN.

## — DISCOVER THE CITY BY FOOT

Tangamanga Park With its 420 hectares, Tangamanga is the second-largest city park in Mexico. It has a lake, several recreational areas and within its limits lays the Museo Laberinto de las Ciencias y las Artes: a beautiful interactive science museum. The park is located 3km from the hostel and is open daily from 6 - 19 (on Mondays till 11).


#### Cerro de San Pedro

In the 17th century, gold and silver was found in Cerro de San Pedro. After the gold rush the town got semiabandoned. Nowadays, it is a popular tourist destination with its beautiful buildings, churches and desertic surroundings. Located 21km (half an hour drive) from the hostel.

On Sundays, you will have a chance to attend a traditional Mexican show at Rancho del Charro: Charrería\*, which is an equestrian show comparable to rodeo. A ticket costs 40 MXN.
